I have provided multiple names or where initials only were provided, names as shown in the Grand Lodge records that might possible be the person. In some cases there were the same names or initials from different areas.

If there is no date shown it often indicates that the man affiliated with the lodge from some other area or the information just was written down. Plus the  $19^{th}$  Century records are not that easy to decipher.

The counties listed may not be correct for the period from 1889 thru 1900. New counties were created as late as 1909, mostly in eastern Washington.

Of the other names provided except for those elected to office, none seem to appear in the records of The Grand Lodge of Washington. That does not preclude their having been a Mason elsewhere and never becoming a Washington State Mason.
